# Safety Meeting Recap



This month we had you all in to get CPR / AED certified.

Here is a recap of some of the things that were discussed /

taught during that time by our own Steve Ball!

The seven steps of CPR are as follows:

- Check for Danger
- Call for Help
- Check the Victim's Airway,
- Give Two Rescue Breaths (if comfortable)
- Perform Chest Compressions
- Switch Roles with the Compressor (if available)
- Continue Compressions until Advanced Medical help arrives.



- After checking the scene and ensuring that the person needs help, you should ask a bystander to call 911 for help
- As soon as an AED is available, turn it on and follow the voice prompts
- Remove clothing and attach pads correctly
- Remove all clothing covering the chest. If necessary, wipe the chest dry (Place one pad on the upper right side of the chest. Place the other pad on the lower left side of the chest, a few inches below the left armpit Note: If the pads may touch, place one pad in the middle of the chest and the other pad on the back, between the shoulder blades)
- Plug the pad connector cable into the AED, if necessary
- Prepare to let the AED analyze the heart's rhythm (Make sure no one is touching the person. Say "CLEAR!" in a loud commanding voice).
- Deliver a shock, if the AED determines one is needed, by pressing shock

After the AED delivers the shock, or if no shock is advised, immediately start
 CPR, beginning with compressions

DO:

ALWAYS tamp down the ground after burying the drain tile!

ALWAYS try to make it look the same as before you dug the tile. You can hardly tell where this freshly dug tile was buried!



#### DON'T:


Forget to check for irrigation before digging tile. Also check the spots you are placing your downspouts to avoid an issue like above.
