# **Safety Meeting Recap**

## **Trailers & Distracted Driving**



Prior to departure, it is important to inspect the trailer and towing vehicle. The following items should all be reviewed to help ensure your safety while towing a trailer:

- Tire pressure should be checked and corrected as necessary on the tow vehicle and trailer, including spares.
- Wheel lug nuts/bolts on the tow vehicle and trailer should be tightened to the correct torque.
- The hitch, coupler, draw bar and other equipment that connect the trailer and tow vehicle are properly secured and adjusted.
- Safety chains should be properly crisscrossed and connected, not touching the road but with enough slack to make turns.
- Wiring should be properly connected between the tow vehicle and trailer, not touching the road but loose enough to ensure turns can be made without disconnecting or damaging the wires.
- Ensure all running lights, brake lights, turn signals and hazard lights are functioning.
- Verify that brakes are working on both the tow vehicle and trailer.
- The breakaway system lanyard should be connected to the tow vehicle but not the safety chains or ball mount.
- All items should be securely fastened on and in the trailer.
- The trailer jack, tongue support and any attached stabilizers should be raised and locked in place.
- Ensure the load distribution in the towing vehicle and trailer are properly balanced.
- Check to ensure you have good visibility from the towing vehicle's side and rear-view mirrors.
- Check to ensure routes and any restrictions that might exist on bridges and tunnels.
- Make sure you have wheel chocks and jack stands.

Snacking, putting on makeup, or concentrating on a cell phone conversation while driving are examples of driver distraction, but the list of possible distractions is endless. Among the highest-risk distractions are:

- using an electronic device to text or talk;
- drowsiness;
- eating and drinking;
- grooming;
- reaching for a moving object;
- looking at an object outside the vehicle;
- adjusting a radio, music player, or sync dashboard system;



### **HR Corner**

Paid Holidays



- Regular Full Time Employees are entitled to the following paid holidays New Years Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, Christmas Eve, and Christmas Day. The following conditions apply to Michigan Gutters Inc's holiday pay policy:
- -An employee must be present at work on his or her last scheduled day prior to the holiday and the first scheduled day after the holiday to receive holiday pay.
- -Holiday pay will not be considered as time worked for the purpose of overtime calculations.
- -Holiday pay is computed at an individual employee's base rate of pay. -If an employee is scheduled to work on a holiday, the employee will be paid his or her regular rate of pay plus eight hours of holiday pay.
- -Holidays will not be paid to employees on any type of unpaid leave.
- -Holidays will not be paid if an employee is absent due to an injury covered by workers compensation.
- -Holidays falling within an approved scheduled vacation will be recorded as holiday pay.
- -If a holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday MGI will identify a day the week prior or the week after that the holiday will be observed.

This months spotlight is on Tiffany!








